Also, your dog is required to be on a leash if they come off your property.



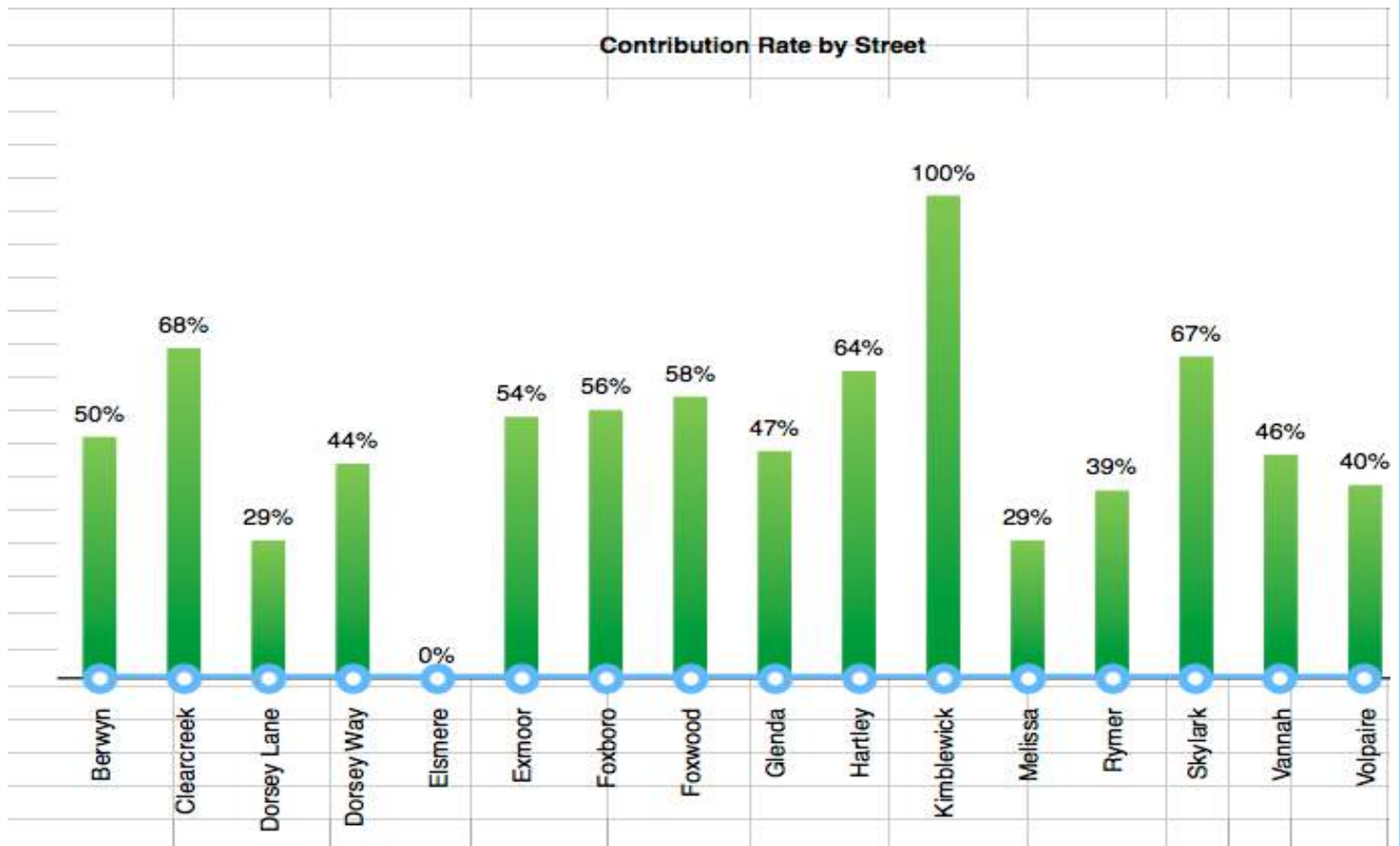
## Smoke – Irritant to Allergies for Some
