For the rest of you, LGE has contracted with a tree service to potentially remove those ash trees that are in danger of falling into the power lines. Why? Well it all has to do with a little—but devastating—beetle known as the ash borer. The ash borer is devastating the ash trees in KY—as well as large portions of the US. As a result many municipalities are removing ash trees to try to slow the spread of the beetles as well as to prevent problems if a weakened or dead tree were to fall. LGE will take the trees down—provided the property owner has given their permission—at LGE's expense. But sadly, this means a great many mature, majestic trees will be lost. In fact, due to the age of the homes in Foxboro many mature trees are reaching the end of their life for one reason or another. It's all part of the cycle with any landscaping plant. However, losing one or more mature trees doesn't mean you shouldn't turn right around and put new trees in. For many, the appeal of this neighborhood stems from the quantity of mature trees that can be found within Foxboro. Putting trees in your landscape—in a location that makes sense—is always going to improve property values and keep the Foxboro "look and feel" in tact. And the only way to get mature trees is to plant young ones and watch them grow. It always goes faster than you think it will. Just like watching your kids grow!!

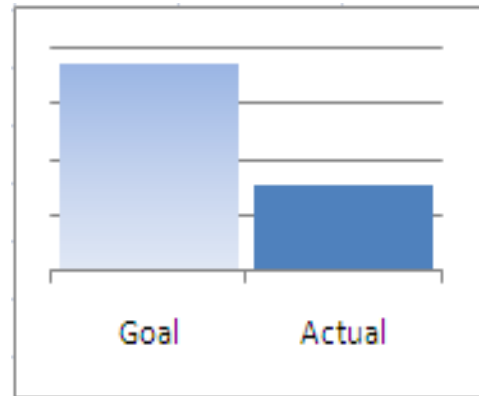

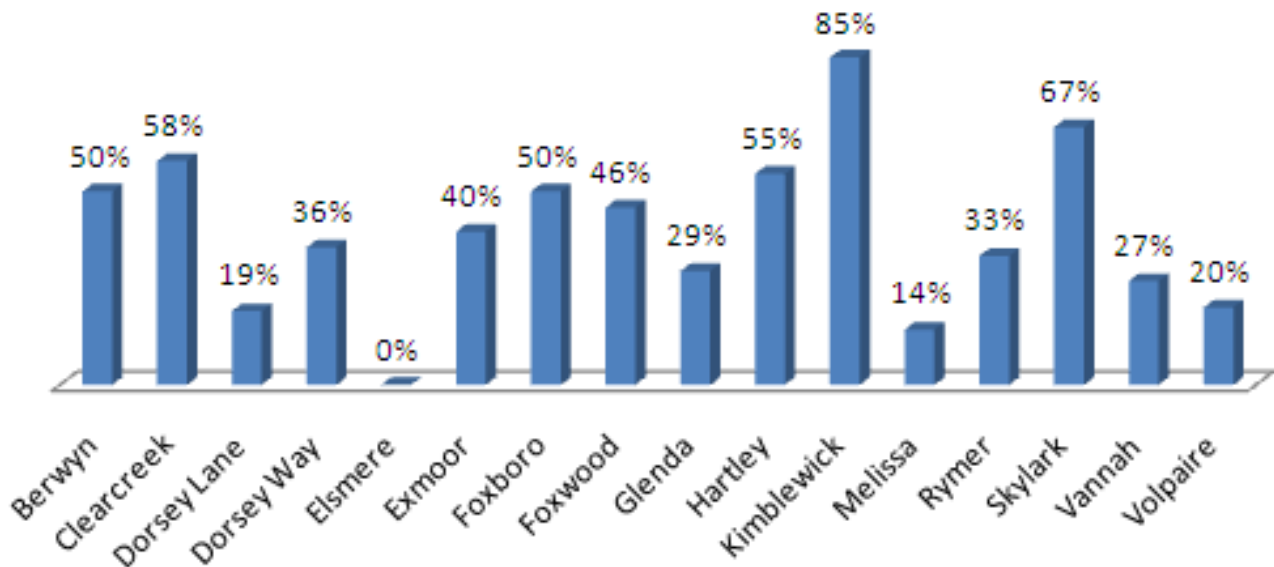
