REPORT A LITTERER



Littering has become a significant problem in the neighborhood, especially along Foxboro Drive across from Foxboro Commons and near the entrance ways. Most of it is due to people throwing cans, bottles, paper bags, etc. from their cars.

Now you can get directly involved in making Foxboro a more litter-free community through the Louisville Metro Report-A-Litterer program. It's aimed at motorists who throw fast-food wrappers, cigarette butts, soda bottles or any type of litter out their car window.

To report a litterer, simply use the contact form found at the Louisville Metro website:

- You must provide the license plate number of the vehicle
- Please also provide the make and model of the vehicle if possible
- Specific location where violation occurred
- Date and time when violation occurred.
- Type of litter.
- Any other descriptive information you can provide

After a litterer is reported, the license plate number is verified (including a description of the vehicle) through the County Clerk's Office. The owner of the vehicle will receive a letter saying that someone reported seeing litter being thrown from their vehicle, and reminding the owner that littering is punishable by a fine of up to \$500 and/or up to a year in jail. An automobile litter bag also will accompany each letter.

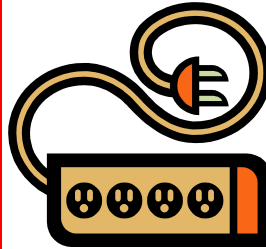

SAFETY TIPS

We have seen an increase in responses to improper use of Multi-Outlet Power Strips. They are like anything else you purchase, you get what you pay for. I suggest you do a little research before buying a power strip based on price only. The following safety info will help you determine proper use.



Multi-Outlet Power Strips

During recent fire safety inspections, multi-outlet power strips are often found on the floor or unattached to work surfaces, which makes this condition the most frequent problem noted in the inspection reports. Many have a fragile internal connection that can be damaged by repeated movement or jarring. Fires have resulted when this connection is damaged, so it is important that the strips be above the floor and mounted to a fixed surface, such as a wall or cabinet. Multi-outlet power strips are an acceptable substitute for extension cords if they are used sensibly. The following guidelines will help you make the best and safest choice for your use.

Examples of Appropriate Use of Power Strips:

Computers, Printers & Computer Peripherals, Fax machines, Televisions, VCRs, Overhead projectors, Electric fans or Radios

Power Strips May NOT be Used For:

Coffee pots or mug warmers, Crock pots or hot plates, Refrigerators or Freezers, Microwave, toasters or toaster ovens, Photocopiers, Portable Heaters or ANY other appliance with a high current (amperage) draw

Appropriate Selection of Power Strips:

- The safest type of power strip will have a fuse or reset button to prevent power overloads.
- Multi-outlet assemblies with built in surge protection are preferred for computer usage.
- It's easy to exceed the capacity of the power strip and circuit, so use caution when adding multiple appliances to the strip.
- Do not use adapters or extension cords between the strip and the outlet.
- Never plug one power strip into a second power strip or into an extension cord.
- Periodically inspect the condition of the power strip, including the cord & plug, test the reset button, and make sure all plugs are firmly inserted into the outlets. If the power strip feels hot, or if a defect is found, discard it and replace with a new one.
- Extension cords are allowed only for temporary installations (hours - days). Multi-outlet strips are built to be used for extended periods, and can be a safe substitute for an extension cord if installed properly.

Normally, the outlet strips will come with hardware or heavy duty double faced tape for mounting.
