FOXBORO IS NOT A DUMPING GROUND!

Have you noticed people driving through Foxboro throwing trash out their car windows, Littering has become a significant problem in the neighborhood, especially along Foxboro Drive across from Foxboro Commons and near the entrance ways. Most of it is due to people throwing cans, bottles, paper bags, etc. from their cars.

Now you can get directly involved in making Foxboro a more litter-free community through the Louisville Metro Report-A-Litterer program. It's aimed at motorists who throw fast-food wrappers, cigarette butts, soda bottles or any type of litter out their car window.

To report a litterer, simply use the contact form found at the Louisville Metro website:

- You must provide the license plate number of the vehicle
- Please also provide the make and model of the vehicle if possible
- Specific location where violation occurred
- Date and time when violation occurred.
- Type of litter.
- Any other descriptive information you can provide

After a litterer is reported, the license plate number is verified (including a description of the vehicle) through the County Clerk's Office. The owner of the vehicle will receive a letter saying that someone reported seeing litter being thrown from their vehicle, and reminding the owner that littering is punishable by a fine of up to \$500 and/or up to a year in jail. An automobile litter bag also will accompany each letter.

Chimney Safety

You should have your chimney cleaned and inspected, before using it this fall. If you have Vent-Free gas logs, I recommend having them serviced and cleaned. Vent-Free logs have several safety systems incorporated into their design and if not maintained could cause the system to shut down.

When using a professional to clean your chimney, gas logs or servicing any of your appliances, make sure they are insured and in good standing with the Better Business Bureau.



Turn Clocks Back

Reminder: the time changes on November 3, 2013. When you change your clock, you need to change your smoke alarm batteries.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY



- Where there are school buses, there are children. Children are likely to do something unexpected, so be prepared.
- When you come to a school bus that is stopped to load or unload passengers, you must **STOP**. By law you must remain stopped until all people are clear of the roadway and the bus is in motion.
- A **STOP** is required when following a bus that is stopped on a two-lane road or you are going in the opposite direction of the bus if the roadway has less than four lanes. Foxboro only has 2 lanes; therefore, all drivers **MUST STOP!**
